

Wi-Fi Hotspots -

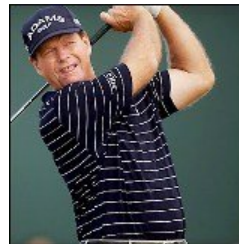

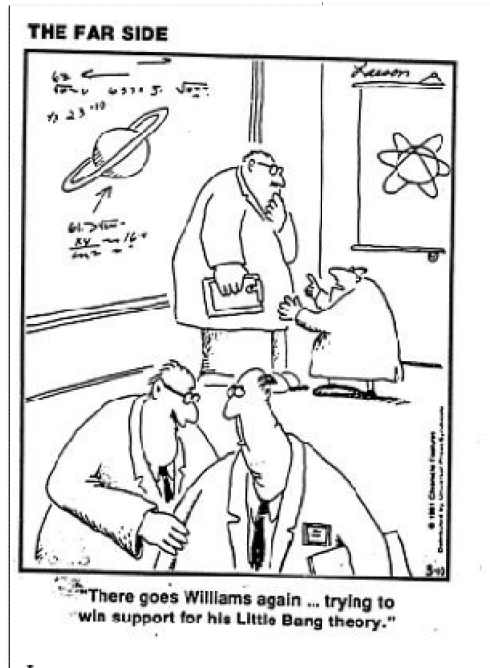

The Blackberry Tour will be launched this week. It will replace the current World edition Blackberry. For Sprint and Verizon customers you can use the device domestically and then travel overseas and with the switch of a button be roaming on GSM networks.

You will pay between \$1 and \$4 per minute while overseas but this is not bad versus making the call from the hotel room! You can also get your e-mail internationally as well. There are plans for a Blackberry Tour with Wi-Fi in 2010. The device with a robust processor will run \$199 with a 2 year agreement. It is a nice upgrade to the previous World Blackberry.
